THE GRAND PALACE AND ROYAL ABU BAKAR MUSEUM

This beautiful building was commissioned by His Royal Highness Sultan Abu Bakar who laid the foundation stone in 1864, and it was completed in 1866 just before the Sultan's first visit to Europe. One of the oldest buildings in Johor Bahru, the Grand Palace Istana Besar Johor has a cosmopolitan quality. It is in the Renaissance style, but with clear Anglo-Malay influence, and it was built by local workmen under the supervision of a European architect. Much of the original furniture was ordered in England by His Majesty Sultan Abu Bakar in 1866, and he personally directed the laying out of the Palace gardens.

The building has been enlarged and renovated several times. In 1912 the east wing was pulled down and the present Banqueting Hall erected in its place.

Today the Palace is mainly used for State ceremonies and official functions, although since 23 February 1982, it has filled an additional role as the Royal Abu Bakar Museum, displaying the art treasures of the Royal collection and historical relics of the Sultanate of Johor.



DESARU FRUIT FARM – AGRO TOURISM – KOTA TINGGI

Tropical Malaysian fruits are abundant all year round in Malaysia. Some fruits are seasonal, like Durian, Rambutan and Mangosteen whilst others like Papaya, Banana, Pineapple, Rose Apple, Star Fruit, Lime, Orange and Coconut are available all year round.


The Desaru Fruit Farm is planted with many different types of tropical fruits. Our experienced guides will give talks on the different plants and show you around the farm in a leisurely bullock-cart ride or in your own vehicle.

The Mini-Zoo houses indigenous animals such as goats, different types of bird including ostriches, peacocks, turkeys and wild fowl. The farm also boasts of an apiary, where local bees tap the flowering fruit trees for nectar. Fishponds dot the farm where anglers can try their luck.

At the Souvenir shop, visitors can find many Malaysian goods such as batik clothing, local handicraft and food products including the farm's products such as honey and the different types of fruit.

The farm is about 100 hectares, 50 hectares are planted with Limau Madu (sweet green oranges) and the rest is planted with Limau Kasturi (musk lime), Belimbing Asam, Durian, Jambu Air or water apple, Ciku, Jambu Madu / Mawar-Guava, Rambutan, Pulasan, Cempedak, Kedondong (great hog plum), Papaya and other local fruits.

Visitors may choose from the different tour packages available ranging from a tour round the farm with a fruit buffet where you can taste the aromatic and juicy tropical fruits to more comprehensive packages which include fishing, lunch and tea!
